Sound Production Studio Available

Several of my colleagues have urged me to make available a service that I provide to all Harrisburg AGO members. I have a small sound production studio if you will... here in my home. Do you have a service or special event that you would like placed on CD? Here are the services I offer: I will take a church service, organ recital, choral concert, special event... etc..., off a provided cassette tape... I will digitally master and edit them, and put them on a CD. I would also need a bulletin or program from the event so I can make a complete CD jacket. If you do not have a bulletin or program, I will come to your church and take pictures of the sanctuary...etc, so that a special jacket can be produced, or if the church would like to provide me pictures, I can scan them and configure them to use for the CD jacket... but only in the event that a bulletin or program doesn't exist. If a church needs recording services, I will come and record the event on cassette so that it can be placed on CD. Also, If someone has an old event or service that they would like taken off "reel to reel" tape or record, I will do that too. Again, I need a bulletin, program or pictures to make the jacket. A price list is available upon request. I have embarked on numerous projects for fun... I've recorded a number of services at my church, and put them on CD... I've taken a few tapes that colleagues have provided me at my request, and placed the contents on CD. I've produced three original CDs... one of which has sold over 400 copies in a nearby resort town. Everyone who has seen or heard my work has urged me to consider offering these services to churches in our area... so, I've decided to.

Please contact me with any questions. I forgot to mention one thing. Let's say it's a big church... that wants 500 or 1000 copies of the CD I master and produce for them to sell.... no problem. I have an established partnership with a company that mass produces (replicates) CDs and the artwork for the jackets. They replicated the CD I have for sale in the nearby resort town, and did a great job. This gets costly, but it is a service I can coordinate as well. In closing, the following thoughts if you will: 1) Restoration is a specialty.... especially anything on reel to reel. 2) References are available upon request. 3) A sample of a finished product... including cover and label design will be provided for final approval before I would make whatever number of CD copies are ordered. 4) I will make cassettes, but the labels will be standard black and white print... nothing fancy.
