"SCHOLARSHIP FOR PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTER OFFERED"

The Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) is offering a scholarship to youth ages 13 to 18, with a proficient piano background, to attend one of the six Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) opportunities offered by the AGO. Interested students should record a tape of piano selections they are currently studying, and submit the tape along with a one-page essay detailing why they want to learn to play the organ. Applicants need not have studied organ previously. Tapes and essays should be sent before May 20th to: Dr. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman, 2200 Brandt Road, Annville, PA 17003. Please include the name of the student, address, phone number, piano teacher, and how many years of lessons.

This year, Pipe Organ Encounters are scheduled for Tulsa, Oklahoma; Tempe, Arizona; Urbana-Champaign, Illinois; Rochester, New York; New Ulm, Minnesota; and Calgary, Alberta, Canada. The scholarship will underwrite the registration fee. Students will cover their transportation fees. POE participants enjoy private and group instruction in technique and church service playing, an overview of organ literature and history, instruction on pipe organ construction and design, field trips, and a chance to meet teenagers with similar interests.
