September Guild Meeting

The Guild is pleased to hold its Monday, September 10th meeting at the Forum Auditorium in downtown Harrisburg. This program brings us back to an instrument that has not seen a Guild program in many years.

The four manual, 70 rank instrument installed by the M. P. Moeller of Hagerstown Maryland in 1968 was recently brought back into playing condition. Credit goes to the Commonwealth Department of General Services for undertaking this \$10,000 project. The console was completely releathered by the Hagerstown Organ Company under the direction of Craig Doyle. In addition, Hagerstown corrected wind leaks throughout the instrument. Under the direction of Colin Walsh and Burton Tidwell, C. M. Walsh Pipe Organbuilders of Sharon Hill, Pennsylvania undertook the complete tuning, regulation, and repair of pipe leathers and dead notes throughout the instrument.

The program, a member/student recital and installation of chapter officers will begin at 7:30 pm. Please enter the Auditorium from the main front entrance under the awning. Playing on the program will be Tony Ciucci, Mark Cole, Brittany Jones, Shawn Gingrich, Don Golden, Kate Luley, Sarah Thrush, and Lois VanOrden. A reception in the Green Room will follow the recital.

Parking is available either on the street or in the Capitol Parking Garage (under the fountain). You will need to enter the garage on Commonwealth Avenue and tell the officer on duty that you are there for the AGO organ recital at the Forum.

DIRECTIONS

The Forum Auditorium is located in downtown Harrisburg at the intersection of Fifth and Walnut Streets.

FROM I-83

Exit I-83 at the Second Street exit. Proceed to Market Square (at the Hilton) and turn right on Market Street. Go three blocks and turn left at the light onto Fifth Street and go one block. The Forum is right in front of you. For parking in the Capitol garage, turn left onto Walnut Street and then take the next right on Commonwealth Avenue. Enter the Garage to the left before the fountain.

FROM I-81

Exit I-81 at the Front Street exit and go south. Proceed down Front Street to Market Street and turn left onto Market Street. Go four blocks and turn left at the light onto Fifth Street and go one block. The Forum is right in front of you. For parking in the Capitol Garage, turn left onto Walnut Street and then take the next right on Commonwealth Avenue. Enter the garage to the left before the fountain.

FROM THE WEST SHORE VIA THE HARVEY TAYLOR BRIDGE

After crossing the bridge turn right onto Front Street. Proceed down Front Street to Market Street and turn left onto Market Street. Go four blocks and turn left at the light onto Fifth Street and go one block. The Forum is right in front of you. For parking in the Capitol Garage, turn left onto Walnut Street and then take the next right on Commonwealth Avenue. Enter the garage to the left before the fountain.

FROM THE WEST SHORE VIA THE MARKET STREET BRIDGE

After crossing the bridge continue on Market Street. Go four blocks and turn left at the light onto Fifth Street and go one block. The Forum is right in front of you. For parking in the Capitol Garage, turn left onto Walnut Street and then take the next right on Commonwealth Avenue. Enter the garage to the left before the fountain.


